

Call for Papers

Special Issue of IJPL 2012

You are invited to submit your full papers for consideration for publication in a special issue of the *International Journal of Pedagogies and Learning* (IJPL: <http://jpl.e-contentmanagement.com/>). The main theme of the special issue will be educational technology and computer-assisted language learning.

Possible topics include, but are not limited to:

- applying technology to the language classroom
- using computer-mediated communication for intercultural exchanges
- managing multimedia/hypermedia environments
- evaluating emerging technologies
- e-learning, collaborative learning and blended learning
- fostering autonomous learning through technology
- training language teachers online.

Timeline

Deadline for submission of full manuscripts: **30 June 2012**. No late submission will be accepted. Articles should follow the 'Guidelines for Authors' noted below.

Receipt of internal review results: **15 July 2012**. The Editor(s) will first review each manuscript to see if it meets the basic requirements and that it is of sufficient quality to be considered for the special issue. Manuscripts that do not meet these requirements will not be sent out for further review.

Receipt of feedback from reviewers: **31 August 2012**. Each article will be blind reviewed by two or three reviewers.

Deadline for final revised submission: **30 September 2012**.

Publication: **November 2012**

Guidelines for Authors (adapted from <http://ojs.e-contentmanagement.com/index.php/jpl/about/submissions#authorGuidelines>)

Preparation of manuscripts: Papers should be in English.

The submission file is required in Microsoft Word DOC or RTF document file format. Any information that might serve to identify the author/s must be excluded from manuscripts submitted for review.

Manuscript length: Articles should be between 3000 and 6000 words in length, including the abstract, notes, appendices and references.

Referencing: The APA Formatting and Style Guide 6th edition is used for the formatting of submissions. This is a link to an easy to use guide to the APA requirements. <https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/1/> For more information, please consult

the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 6th edition, second printing.

'American' or 'English' spellings are acceptable, providing they are used consistently. Translation of articles from other languages into English is encouraged and should be provided by professional translators. The Editor(s) reserve the right to make editorial and literary corrections.

Permission and acknowledgment: Authors are responsible for obtaining permission to quote copyrighted material. At the end of your article, please acknowledge sources of funding/support, other participants and copyright holders who have given permission to use their material.

[Pre-Submission Checklist]

1. The submission has not been previously published, nor is it before another journal for consideration (or an explanation has been provided to the Editor(s)).
2. The submission file is in Microsoft Word or RTF document file format.
3. All URL addresses in the text (e.g., <http://pkp.sfu.ca>) are activated and ready to click.
4. The text is single-spaced; uses a 12-point font; employs italics rather than underlining; and all illustrations, figures and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points, rather than at the end.
5. The text adheres to the Author Guidelines noted above.
6. The text has had the authors' names removed. If an author is cited, "Author" and year are used in the in-text references and reference list, instead of author's name and year of publication/presentation. The author's name has also been removed from the document's Properties, which in Microsoft Word is found in the File menu.
7. *Referencing:* The author is responsible for ensuring the content of his/her paper meets academic integrity guidelines. That is, the content of all papers must be the author's own work except where explicitly and fully acknowledged. Information derived from the published or unpublished work of others should be acknowledged using the author-date system with in-text citation and a works cited reference list in accordance with the APA referencing guidelines.
8. *Copyright:* Normally short quotations and similar copied material (e.g., diagrams, tables) directly related to the content of the work from which a copy is to be taken are considered 'fair dealing' for scholarly purposes and do not require the copyright owner's permission. However, the source must be clearly indicated and acknowledged. If substantial portions of a copyright work are used, or if the author wishes to reproduce drawings or photographs that are the original work of another person, the author is responsible for contacting the copyright owner and obtaining permission to use that copyright material in her/his works. Moreover, if the copyright owner requires payment, the authors must pay those costs. The Asia-Pacific Association for Computer-Assisted Language Learning (APACALL), the sponsoring organisation of this Journal, will not pay copyright fees.

The Editor(s) reserve the right: to place individual papers in formats for viewing and printing on the Journal Website; to submit the published papers to indexing, abstracting and/or non-commercial reproduction services such as Australian Education Index (AEI) and the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC); and to submit the published papers to institutional e-print repositories.
